2020 Art Contest:

Create an 8.5" x 11" piece of artwork reflecting on the theme of connection with or inspiration from the older adults in our families, neighborhoods, schools, or greater community.

2020 Essay Contest:

Write a short non-fiction essay or story of up to 300 words on **one** of the following prompts/themes:

- What does it mean to have connection with our elders? Why is this connection important to you?
- Why are seniors an important part of our community?
- Tell us about an older adult who has inspired you. This can be someone from your community, your family, your school, your place of worship, a scout troop or sports team, etc.

Grade Level Categories:

K-5 (Elementary School)

6-8 (Middle School)

9-12 (High School)

Rules, Eligibility, and Prizes:

- All work must be the original work of the student who submits it.
- Open to all Chatham County, North Carolina K-12 students, including public school, home-school, private school and charter school students.
- Immediate family members of Chatham County Council on Aging employees are not eligible.
- Students may enter one or both contest categories. Limit of one entry per category, per student.
- The top artwork and essay from each grade level category will be featured in an upcoming print and digital issue of the *Chatham Senior Times*, which has a combined print and digital readership of over 3000. Winners will receive a copy of the print edition in which their artwork appears and two free passes to attend the Council on Aging's "Chatham Bakes" community bake-off event in March.
- Second and third place winners in each grade level category will have their artwork or essay featured in an upcoming digital issue of the *Chatham Senior Times* and will receive one free pass to attend the "Chatham Bakes" community bake-off event in the Spring.
- All entrants may have their entries displayed at one of the two Chatham County Council on Aging centers (*Eastern Chatham Senior Center in Pittsboro or Western Chatham Senior Center in Siler City*) for the enjoyment of our center visitors, as well as at the "Chatham Bakes" event in the Spring.
- All submissions become the property of the Chatham County Council on Aging and can be used in print and digital media with attribution to the student who created them.
- Submissions will be judged on creativity and style, as well as strength and clarity of message.
- Mailed entries must be postmarked by February 28, 2020. All hand-delivered and emailed entries must be received by noon, March 2, 2020.
- Winners will be announced on or around March 15, 2020.
- The Chatham County Council on Aging reserves the right to disqualify any entries deemed inappropriate for general audiences or that are not in keeping with the positive theme of the contest.
- All entries must include an entry form signed by a parent/guardian.
